> THE SYMBOLISM OF THE ARCH The ARCH is an architectural design, usually constructed of stone masonry, that is used to span openings and support heavy loads from above. The history of the arch goes back to Egyptian times, and was used extensively in Roman architecture. The Arch has advantages over other types of designs because it can span greater distances, support greater loads, yet provide openness and views to beyond the arch itself.

The ARCH does not find its advantages in large and impressive columns or lintels, but rather in individual blocks of smaller stones which together join as one ARCH. These stones are called voussoirs (ringstones) which line the arch, and a keystone which locks the ringstones of the arch together to give it great strength, openness and beauty. Strength of purpose comes from individuals who join together in a common goal and support each other just like the stones of an ARCH. Individuals standing shoulder to shoulder, just like the finely tapered stones of the ARCH, can achieve great things. Individuals, businesses and community leaders can find common purpose and meaning from the symbolism of the ARCH. Are you willing to stand shoulder to shoulder with others in the common goal of protecting and preserving the GREAT STONE VIADUCT?
