

John has built 43 steamboats over the past 6 years for private collections and museums, and has just recently completed "The Eliza H" depicting the sternwheel vessel once owned by famed Bellaire resident Jacob Heatherington. This steamboat was named after his beloved wife, Eliza Heatherington, whose likeness appears in the old Greenwood Cemetery over looking Bellaire. The boat was piloted by one of Heatherington's sons and used in coal operations from the Heatherington coal mines. Bowman has written 3 books on steamboats, including his most recent book Steamboats on the Western Rivers in the Civil War.
